GRANTS AWARDED

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CFY PROGRAM WORKSHOP — JANUARY 27



CFY hosted its annual in-person Program Workshop at The Long Center, featuring an Italian-style dinner for participating programs. Discussions focused on strengthening the CFY network, exploring new funding opportunities, and enhancing program support. CFY extends appreciation to Capogna's Dugout, Board Members Fred Miller and Dawn Daugherty, Sandy Clayton, Stephanie DeMaio and Big Al Capogna for their hospitality.

RICHARD O. JACOBSON EDUCATION PROGRAM SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships were awarded totaling \$407,500 during the "Breakfast at the Ballpark" events on March 2 (Phillies) and March 5 (Blue Jays), where students met their sponsoring partners. For the Class of 2026, CFY awarded 57 scholarships from 527 applications across three categories:

- ROJ Traditional Scholarships 26 awards (\$10,000 or \$5,000)
- CFY/SPC Scholarships 18 awards (full tuition, fees, and books for three years toward an AA degree)
- Vocational/Trade Scholarships 13 awards (\$3,500, with full coverage for PTech students after financial aid)



BOARD LEADERSHIP TRANSITION



After four years of significant growth, Fred Miller has passed the Board Chair role to long-time Trustee Hoyt Hamilton at the January 7 meeting. The former Clearwater Vice Mayor aims to continue advancing CFY's impact throughout Pinellas County.

ATHLETIC GRANT FUNDING



In Q1, CFY awarded \$137,332 in athletic grants to expand youth sports access across Pinellas County. Support included equipment matching grants and registration assistance for organizations such as the Pinellas County Sheriff's PAL Boxing, Dunedin Fine Arts Center, Clearwater Little League, and the St. Petersburg Gators, among 19 programs funded.

CLEARWATER ELITE CLASSIC PRESENTED BY SHRINERS HOSPITAL



CFY participated in the largest NCAA DI softball event outside the Women's College World Series. CFY presented \$21,600 to the Clearwater Lady Bombers to support equipment purchases, travel, and registration for 2025. Players and coaches joined ESPN's Beth Mowins, Jessica Mendoza, and CFY Board Member Michele Smith for a ceremonial presentation on February 13.
