### **BANQUET ON THE BEACH**

CFY was officially chartered as a nonprofit organization by the State of Florida in February 1972 but was active in the community organizing youth athletic programming for 6 years prior. The 52nd anniversary celebration was an opportunity to

pay homage to the growth of the organization, transitioning from the role of organizer to funder and facilitator in recent years while expanding beyond Clearwater's city limits to serve youth across Pinellas County. The event raised over \$250,000 in support of CFY initiatives. Supporters can expect Banquet on the Beach to return each spring (the 2025 date is April 25) as CFY's principal annual fundraiser supporting the mission of elevating the youth of Pinellas County through access to skill building programs where children of all backgrounds can learn, play, and grow together.

In 2023, CFY was provided with a lightly used Mac Book Pro to provide to a Richard O. Jacobson Post Secondary Scholarship winner. Based on the experience and interaction with the winner, CFY then contacted technology partners in the ommunity to gauge their

Beginning in 2024, CFY partnered with Bizco to offer 5 iPad Air devices with Magic Keyboards to recipients of our Post-Secondary Scholarships. #### **PINELLAS EDUCATION FOUNDATION**



CFY continues to build upon its' mission of elevating the youth of Pinellas County through its partnership with the Pinellas Education Foundation, with another \$50,000 contribution to the Take Stock In Children Program. Through the Foundation's partnership with the Florida Prepaid College Foundation, each donor dollar is matched, doubling the impact of this award to benefit an additional 11 Pinellas County children for the 4th year in a row.

The longstanding Richard O. Jacobson Postsecondary Scholarship Program and second year CFY/ SPC Scholarship growing to 40 scholarships awarded in 2025. Clearwater, FL: CFY's 2025 Richard O. Jacobson (ROJ) Postsecondary Scholarship Program has reached new heights with a total of \$182,000 to be awarded to Pinellas County students this summer, up from \$133,500 in 2024. The final distribution of awards includes: thirteen \$10,000 college/university awards, eight \$5,000 college/university awards, and three \$3,500 technical/trade awards, for a total of 24 lives impacted. Each honoree will have the opportunity to meet their scholarship sponsor at a special event- Breakfast at the Ballpark – at the Philadelphia Phillies' Baycare Ballpark on March 11 at 8:00 a.m.

The Phillies will sponsor that event and the Toronto Blue Jays will sponsor a new, similar event at TD Ballpark on March 19 at 8:30 a.m. to celebrate 16 scholarship recipients through CFY's year-old program with St. Petersburg College. These Pinellas County seniors will work toward their AA degree from SPC.





### **CONTINUOUS GIVING AWARD**

CFY Comtuous Grant Program including the Dunedin Fine Art Center that services a greater number of children enrolled in Title 1 schools across Pinellas County with awarding \$13,000 for the student registrations for Summer Camps and their After School Program. Secondly, as CFY expands its relationship with Pinellas Sheriff, the Sheriff's PAL Boxing Program grows in support with a \$33,00 donation to continue their programming.



# **KICK OFF TO WATER SAFETY**

## **PROGRAM WORKSHOP**

Third annual CFY program workshop at Localz Bar was held on January 28, 2025, where over 45 youth sport and program providers attended to learn more about CFY's expanded geographic support, grant program offerings and ways they may assist with working with the CFY Network of funding partners to further expand funding to open up access to all youth regardless of their ability to pay registration fees.



## **GRANTS AWARDED**

In the first grants cycle awarded over \$35,000 in Athlete Scholarship Reimbursement and Equipment Supplement. In this cycle the grants impacted 7 different programs including: Lady Canes Softball, Chargers Soccer Club, Largo Jr. Packers, STP Elite, Oldsmar Little League, Seed of Promise Track Club and High Point Community Pride.
